What is the OneCare Vermont (OneCare) Accountable Care Organization?

Accountable Care Organizations are groups of doctors, hospitals, and other health care providers who voluntarily come together to give coordinated high quality care to their patients in a cost effective way. OneCare works to bring together existing care services in communities across Vermont to keep patients healthy and provide more coordinated care.

Nine communities are currently participating in this model. Provider participation is diverse and includes:

- 10 hospitals and all of their employed providers
- 31 independent primary care physician practices and 30 independent specialty practices
- 2 Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)
- OneCare partners with: Home Health and Hospice, Skilled Nursing Facilities, Area Agencies on Aging, and Designated Agencies for Mental Health and Substance Use across communities

Will my Insurance Benefits change?

No. OneCare will not change your insurance benefits

- Your eligibility for insurance has not changed
- Your insurance benefits have not changed in anyway
- There is no change in the direct care you receive from any doctor

How will OneCare benefit me?

OneCare is designed to make it easier for doctors and hospitals to work together to keep patients healthy and to provide the highest quality of care in the right place and at the right time. This is about prioritizing prevention and empowering all of us in health care – patients and providers – with greater access to information to improve the patient care experience and ultimately their health.

Does my doctor participate in the ACO network?

What if my doctor is not part of the OneCare ACO network? What about care received outside of Vermont?

There will be no impact on you if your provider is not a part of OneCare. You are still free to see any doctor and this includes providers and hospitals that are out-of-state, if they accept your insurance.

Do I need to sign up for OneCare?

No, you do not need to do anything! If your doctor or hospital is participating in the OneCare ACO network, you will receive a notification letter.
