What is OneCare Vermont?

OneCare Vermont is a state-wide Accountable Care Organization (ACO) working with Medicare, Vermont Medicaid and the Commercial Exchange Shared Savings Program. OneCare Vermont comprises an extensive network of providers, including several of Vermont's hospitals, 2 New Hampshire hospitals, hundreds of primary and specialty care physicians and Advance Practice Providers, federally qualified health centers, and several rural health clinics, to coordinate the health care of approximately 102,000 combined Medicare, Medicaid and Commercial Exchange Vermont beneficiaries.

OneCare Vermont is designed to make it easier for doctors and hospitals to work together to keep you healthy and to provide you with the highest quality of care in the right place, and at the right time.

It is not an insurance plan or company, nor is OneCare Vermont, a Medicare supplemental insurance plan or a Medicare Advantage HMO. In fact, with OneCare Vermont you and your providers will be better able to decide what is best for you.

Will my Medicare benefits change?

No. OneCare Vermont will not change your Medicare benefits.

- You may still see your current doctors and are free to choose any doctor or hospital that accepts Medicare.
- OneCare Vermont will not change your premiums or out of pocket costs.
- OneCare Vermont will not change your prescription drug benefits including Medicare Part D.
- Any supplemental insurance plans you may have will not be affected by OneCare Vermont.

Will my care be different?

Because improving your health is the number one goal of OneCare Vermont, your providers may focus more on helping you make healthy choices. If you have a chronic condition like diabetes or heart disease, there may be extra support for you between visits with your doctors.


How will OneCare Vermont benefit me?

- Your doctors and other providers will focus on wellness, preventing illness and managing chronic conditions - all intended to reduce your need for treatments and/or stays in the hospital.
- If you have several doctors caring for you, it will be easier for them to share test results and other information so they can make the best decisions about your care. This will improve planning and reduce duplication of services.
- By working closely together, your providers will learn from each other about the best ways to deliver safe, high-quality care to you.

What if my doctors are not part of the OneCare Vermont network? Or what if I receive care while I am away from Vermont?

There will be no impact on you as a Medicare beneficiary – you are free to see any provider you choose, regardless of whether or not they are a OneCare Vermont participant. This includes doctors and hospitals that are out of state.

Do I need to sign up for OneCare Vermont?

No, you do not need to do anything! If your physician is participating in OneCare Vermont, you will receive a letter with additional information.
